Finding a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) in your Region

1. Open your internet browser and go to the following link: www.bacb.com
2. Click on the brown button labeled “Find a Certificant”
3. Several search options will appear
 - Certification Type: Check the BCBA and/or BCBA-D boxes
 - RBT and BCaBA are paraprofessional levels
 - Status: Check the Active box
 - Only list certificants who: You can leave these blank
 - Country: Select the relevant country in which the client resides
 - Optional location options: Be as specific as desired
 - State/Territory: Select the state (U.S. only) or province (Canada only)
 - Postal Code: Enter the zip code of the client’s residence
 - Post Code Range: Select an option for how far from the postal code you are willing to look for a certificant
 - City: Enter the name of the city, or a nearby city, in which the client resides
 - Last Name: Enter the last name of a specific certificant for which you might be searching
4. Check the box to agree to the Terms of Use
5. Click the grey button labeled “Search”
6. Wait while the system searches for the relevant BCBAs
7. A list of names will appear along with their certification level.
8. Select the name of the BCBA you wish to contact
 - Details such as the BCBA’s location, certification information, etc. will appear
9. To reach out to the BCBA, among these details will be the word “Contact” followed by a blue link of the BCBA’s name. Click on the blue name. (Note: Some BCBAs have opted not to be contacted via the registry and will therefore *not* have a Contact option.)
10. A contact form will appear and will request the following information: Your name, your email address, and Type of Contact - choose the most relevant from the available options
11. Check the “I’m not a robot” box
12. When ready to send, select the grey button labeled “Send Message” towards the bottom of the contact form
13. Your message will then be submitted
